
No one likes being told what to do especially on holiday - but please do follow our farm rules to keep you, and our furry friends, safe and well

WASH YOUR HANDS! Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water after you have touched animals, fences or other surfaces in animal areas, and after removing dirty shoes or boots that have been worn on the farm. Hand sanitisers are good - but nothing beats bugs like ol' fashioned soap and water!
